SUMMARY OF POSITION

- An independent practitioner working as part of a multi-disciplinary team, who plays a key role in improving access to housing/shelter, transition support and “eviction prevention “ supports.
- Grounded in person-centered, anti-oppressive, culturally safe and social justice-oriented practice and committed to building trusting relationships, the individual creates and maintains a safe and welcoming environment for the people we serve.
- Develops, implements and advocates for housing services/supports and programming to meet the needs of those we are serving.
- Provides a continuum of services and supports with a strong emphasis on the timely acquisition of housing and housing related services, system advocacy, health promotion, problem-solving and comprehensively addressing the social determinants of health.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Housing and Social Services Programming and Supports

- Provide on-going supports, coordination/integration and planning to assist the people we serve with finding/keeping housing and other health and social supports and services, to live well. (i.e. money management, budgeting, living skills, employment preparation, benefits etc.)
- Develop and coordinate individualized care plans addressing short-term and long-term goals in collaboration with participants, interdisciplinary team members and external partners.
- Coordinate relevant programming resources, partnerships and relationships to assist individuals to find places to stay according to their desires and needs and to access additional supports where needed.
- Maintain a high level of knowledge and awareness of community resources, rent and income assistance services and programming, landlords and other service agencies involved in short and long-term housing solutions for youth and adults.

Crisis-Intervention and De-Escalation

- Integrate trauma-informed/healing centered principles and strategies in preventing and diffusing situations
- Create and facilitate a calm, compassionate environment for those experiencing distress.
- Evaluate immediate safety risks, de-escalate and diffuse conflict in an assertive, timely fashion
- Act as a first responder (CPR/First aid)

Program Administration:

- Develop programming as required (information sessions, resources, groups, events)
- Provide support to students/volunteers as appropriate
- Compile informational and statistical reports as required
- Maintain complete and accurate documentation and records and participate in chart reviews and case conferences.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Relevant combination of education and experience in the areas of social services or related field.
- Minimum 2 years' of service support in a community-based setting
- Demonstrated knowledge of housing/shelter resources in the community and of the unique issues facing folks who are subjected to poverty and homelessness.
- Experience working with youth, young adults is an asset
- Criminal Record Check required
- Child Abuse Record Check required
- Knowledge and understanding of diverse traditions and cultural practices with an emphasis on honouring and understanding of Indigenous practices.
